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## J-1 Student Intern Health Insurance Agreement

## Health Insurance

All J-1s and their J-2 dependents are required by federal regulations to have health insurance meeting minimum standards. To meet the minimum standards, the health insurance selected by people in J status must:

- Include medical benefits of at least **\$50,000** per accident or illness.
- Include at least \$7,500 worth of "repatriation" coverage to send a body back to the home country if the insured should die.
- Include at least **\$10,000** for "evacuation" coverage to send the insured to hospitals in his/her own country
- Include deductibles that do not exceed **\$500**.

J-1 Student Interns may purchase a student health insurance that meets these minimum standards from the Student Health Center, in Morewood Gardens, 1<sup>st</sup> floor, (corner of Forbes and Morewood Avenues). <u>www.studentaffairs.cmu.edu/HealthServices/insurance/index.html</u>

\*\* Please note: This insurance may only be purchased during the first 31 days of your program at CMU.

By signing this document, you agree that you either:

- 1) currently have health insurance that will cover you during the entirety of your program at Carnegie Mellon, and meets the minimum standards outlined above; OR
- 2) will purchase health insurance that meets these minimum standards immediately upon arriving at Carnegie Mellon University; OR
- 3) will be covered by another health insurance policy that meets these minimum requirements by the start of your program at Carnegie Mellon University.
